As part of your treatment at Concord Oral Surgery, P.A., the doctors may sometimes write a prescription for a narcotic pain medication following a procedure. This is done only when the doctor feels it is necessary in order to make you more comfortable following your procedure. If you have been prescribed a narcotic pain medication we would like you to be aware of the following concerns and guidelines:

- Take your medication exactly as prescribed.
- Read all instructions that come with your medication.
- Using this drug may cause addiction. While addiction is more common in people with a personal or family history of addiction, it can occur in anyone.
- Taking more than the prescribed amount of medication or using with alcohol or other drugs can cause you to stop breathing resulting in coma, brain damage, or death.
- Opioids can slow reaction time, cause drowsiness, or cloud judgement. It may be unsafe for you to drive or operate heavy machinery while taking your medication.
- Opioids are at risk of being diverted by anyone with access to your home. Opioids should be stored in a safe and secure place, such as a locked cabinet or safe.
- Unused opioids should be disposed of according to the label or patient information. These medications should not be flushed down the toilet. If there are no specific instructions, unused medications may be returned to a take-back location or mixed with a small amount of water or an undesirable waste substance such as used coffee grounds or cat litter.
